REPORT ON THE SHOE MAKING PROJECT BY MASAKA WOMEN CRAFTS ASSOCIATION KAMWENGE FOR THE YEAR 2023.

Hello our dear comrades and partners in development, we bring warm greeting from the people of masaka women handcraft Association in Kamwenge of Uganda. Thank you so much for your continued and relentless support to the skilling and empowerment of women and young girls in Kamwenge district may God bless you so much. Below is a summary of the report about the activities we managed to accomplish with your support.

- 1. We received a donation of 416 Euros for the purchase of a shoes making sewing machine. Photos are attached.
- 2. We received 95 Euros from Lukas sperling foundation of Germany as support for the procurement of Materials to produce the first batch of shoes.
- 3. We were able to procure materials and for making 30 pairs of shoes at a production cost of 15000/ Uganda shillings and selling at 20000/ Uganda shillings.
- 4. All the 30 pairs have been sold at 20000/ Uganda shillings each giving us a sales revenue 600000/ Uganda shillings giving us a profit of 150,000/ after sales.
- 5. Next year we are going to increase our production to 100 pairs of shoes therefore we are budgeting to procure materials for the production of 100 pairs of shoes. The budget to produce 100 pairs of shoes is 2,000,000/ Uganda shillings.
- 6. Therefore, we are requesting for another round of support to continue to grow our production and market for the shoes project this is going to empower the women and young girls of masaka group.
- 7. We are going to recruit and train more women and girls on how to make shoes and do tailoring. These skills are creating jobs and improving households. These women are getting money to feed their homes and take their kids to school because most of these women are widows and single mothers and orphans who have dropped out of school due to lack of school fees.
- 8. We also plan to add on another sewing machine for clothes which is worth 1500000/ Uganda shillings

NB: We hereby once again come to you for another round of support in the next year of 2024 so that we can contribute to the skilling of women and create employment for these vulnerable poor women.
